

Information sheet on German-Syrian Hospital Partnerships

Objective/Approach

German-Syrian hospital partnerships develop genuine institutional cooperation with the goal of improving access to medical care for the entire population and strengthening the capacities of the Syrian health system. Broad geographical coverage across all regions of Syria and a wide range of medical topics – driven by the medical expertise of the applicants and local needs in Syria – is sought.

Duration:

- Project duration of up to two years.**

Funding amount:

The amount of funding depends on the project needs, previous experience in dealing with third-party funding, and project implementation.

up to 125,000.00 €

- Applicants with no or limited experience are advised to apply for smaller grant amounts.
- For contracts with a value of 125,000 € or more, an audit will be conducted at the German partner institution.

up to 250,000.00 €

- For contracts with a value of 250,000.00 € or more, two audits will be conducted at the German partner institution.

- Direct forwarding of funding to the Syrian partner institution is not possible.**

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Eligible costs must be documented with invoices. For example, the procurement of material goods in Syria can be invoiced. Costs for Syrian experts can also be invoiced. In all cases, the invoice must be made payable to the German partner institution. Please always observe public procurement law.

The basics of Hospital Partnerships

Capacity building:

The focus of hospital partnerships is to strengthen the capacity of healthcare professionals through continuing education and training measures. Projects that primarily focus on equipment procurement are not eligible for funding.

Context-appropriate activities:

Planned activities must be consistent with the local context.

Adaptability:

Approaches should be used that can be adapted to changing conditions.

Long-term partnerships:

The aim of our hospital partnerships is to establish long-term collaborations.

Multidisciplinarity:

Collaboration in multidisciplinary teams involving different professional groups enriches the projects.

Inclusion:

All people, regardless of their different backgrounds, are to be included. The aim is to promote diversity and equal opportunities.

Sustainability:

Projects should consider measures that can be established sustainably.
